







Public Statement of Commitment to the Prevention of Gender-Based Violence

On behalf of the Executive Leadership team of Bendigo Kangan Institute (BKI), we want to reaffirm our unwavering commitment to promoting gender equity and eradicating gender-based violence. We are deeply saddened by the recent deaths of women across Australia, as well as the prevalence of all types of gender-based violence from sexual harassment to psychological abuse and coercion. We are determined to play an active role in ending all types of gender-based violence and gender inequality.

The TAFE sector holds a unique position to drive substantial social change in terms of gender equity and the prevention of gender-based violence. We see this in the courses that we teach that directly address these issues, as well as the broader impact that we have on our communities. We are wholeheartedly dedicated to collaborating with other Victorian TAFEs to implement the Respect and Equality in TAFE framework, which serves as a blueprint for planning and taking action against gender-based violence and gender inequality.

Gender-based violence encompasses various forms, including sexual, physical, mental, and economic harm, threats of violence, coercion, manipulation, and gender-based discrimination. When experienced, these issues have a profoundly detrimental impact on both our students and employees, contributing to lower student completion and retention rates, employee turnover, and skills shortages.

By deconstructing harmful gender stereotypes, we believe we will be in better position to help improve men's health outcomes. Gender inequality has adverse repercussions that affect all of us.
