

WHERE DO I START?

PREREQUISITES

You may need to meet some entry requirements in order to enrol in one of our programs. These requirements vary for each course, but may include:

- A minimum age (some courses require that you are over 18 so that you can legally work in the industry)
- Satisfactory language, literacy and numeracy skills
- A Police Check or a Working with Children Check (if you are working in an industry that has contact with children or the public)
- Evidence of immunisations (if you are working in a health care environment)

The prerequisites are not designed to be a blocker to entry in the course, but to ensure that you are compliant and ready to be employed in the industry once you complete your training with us.

An apprenticeship is a great way to combine structured training and paid employment.

You can begin while you're still at school or if you are older than 15 years of age. You don't need a secondary school certificate to start an apprenticeship, although this is highly regarded by most employers.

As an apprentice you will earn an income while you are learning your trade. Your apprenticeship will combine study on the job or at Bendigo TAFE, along with hands-on practical training in the workplace. When you finish your apprenticeship, you will have a nationally recognised qualification and skills that can take you anywhere in Australia and to many overseas countries as well.

Once you've found an employer, you both must contact an AASN to sign a training apprenticeship contract. Select Bendigo TAFE as your preferred training provider to get started. If you are eligible for a Health Care Card, make sure you apply for one prior to enrolling so you are eligible for concession fees.

The Indigenous Education Centres
(IEC) at our Bendigo and Echuca
campuses are innovative environments
that foster and promote Indigenous
learning, while supporting Indigenous
students undertaking study and
training in a wide array of courses
across the institute.

Honouring the traditional landowners of the area across Bendigo and Echuca which include the Djaara people of the Dja Dja Wurrung and the Wollithiga people of the Yorta Yorta Nation, the centre merges the cultural heritage and values of these landowners with contemporary Aboriginal culture and strong networks with key Aboriginal organisations to ensure that our students are supported through their time with us.

As one of the state's largest providers of training and education, Bendigo TAFE delivers a range of courses and programs. Our courses are designed in consultation with communities and employers which means that Aboriginal students gain skills and knowledge while improving their networks and employment options.

The Indigenous Education Centre plays an important role in supporting Aboriginal students at Bendigo TAFE, providing them with a welcoming environment at all times and assisting them where required to find the course of their choice, getting enrolled and starting their training.

OUR STUDENTS

The IEC welcomes all Indigenous
Australians. Our students come from
many different backgrounds ranging from
early school leavers to people over 50.
We support students engaged in a
variety of courses across the TAFE, from
foundation to entry level courses which
include language, literacy, numeracy and
computer skills, cultural education and
advanced courses from the Certificate
I level all the way to diplomas and
advanced diplomas.

Students learn through a combination of classroom, practical, flexible and online learning techniques. A majority of the students engage in the course of their choice at the TAFE and use the IEC for social activities or for support (if required). We also conduct a number of events through the year, celebrating Aboriginal culture and key milestones to which all the students are invited to along with their friends and family.

RECONNECT

Reconnect is a free service that can provide personalised support and course related financial assistance to people who haven't completed Year 12 or equivalent (certificate II or higher). To be eligible for the Reconnect program you must be:

- Aged between 17 and 64 years
- Out of school for at least 14 weeks
- Not in full time employment for at least 12 months
- Not enrolled in other education or training
- Have not completed year 12 or equivalent
- Need extra support to succeed in education and training.



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FREE TAFE COURSES

How much you pay is determined by the course you enrol in, the scheduled hours you commit to undertake, your eligibility for a government-funded place and any concession entitlements you might be eligible for.

GOVERNMENT SUBSIDIES

You may be eligible for government subsidised training if you are:

- An Australian citizen
- An Australian permanent resident (holder of a permanent visa)
- A New Zealand citizen

And are any of the following:

- Under 20 years of age
- Seeking to enrol in a Foundation Skills
 List course (and do not hold a Diploma
 or above qualification or are receiving
 core skills training in other sectors)
- Seeking to enrol in VCE or VCAL
- Seeking to enrol in an apprenticeship
- 20 years and older and 'upskilling' by seeking to enrol in a course at a higher level than your existing qualification.

There are further restrictions on the number of courses you can undertake in a year or at a level, as well as a limit to one Free TAFE course per eligible student.

CONCESSION

You may be entitled to a concession on your tuition fees if you are in a government funded place and you meet the below eligibility criteria:

- Are enrolled in a Certificate I to Certificate IV course
- Hold a valid Concession / Pension card issued by Centrelink or are named on a Concession / Pension card as a dependent child / spouse

If your tuition fee concession application is successful, your concession fee will be charged at 20% of the government funded tuition rate for your program.

FULL FEE

If you are not eligible for governmentsubsidised training you will pay the full fee listed on the respective course page.

ADDITIONAL FEES

In addition to the tuition fee you will need to pay the Student Services Fee of up to \$200 and any applicable materials and consumables fees.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

HEALTH CARE CARD

If you are eligible for a Health Care Card you may be eligible to pay concession fees. Make sure you apply for one through Centrelink prior to enrolling as you will need to present your card to get the discounted fee at the time of enrolment.

FLEXIBLE PAYMENT PLAN

Payment plans are available to anyone enrolling into a certificate I. II. III and IV course. Bendigo TAFE offers eligible students the option of paying their course fees over time by setting up either weekly or fortnightly instalment payments to cover their tuition, materials and consumables.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

At Bendigo TAFE, we believe in rewarding hard work and achievement. We offer a number of scholarships and grants to help pay for your course.

VET STUDENT LOANS

A student loan scheme is available for eligible students and courses to assist in the payment of tuition fees whilst studying at TAFE. These are called VET Student Loans and replaced the VET FEE-HELP scheme from 1 January 2017.

Loans are capped according to the course you are studying. These loans are income contingent and interest free and repaid via the Australian Taxation Office when your income reaches a certain threshold. For 2018-2019 income year this threshold is \$51,957. The loan will continue to be a debt to the government until it is repaid.

You will still have to pay the student services fee, materials and consumables fee (if studying a government funded course) and other non-tuition fees (if applicable) at the time of enrolment. To be eligible for a VET Student Loan, you must be an Australian citizen: holder of a permanent humanitarian visa who will be residing in Australia for the duration of study; or a qualifying New Zealand citizen.

VET student loans will not be granted to students who do not meet the above criteria.



The Australian government has established the Australian Apprenticeships Incentives Programme to encourage genuine opportunities for skills based training and people to enter into skills based training through Australian Apprenticeships.

Apprentices may be eligible for a range of payments to assist them with the initial set up costs and completion of their apprenticeship.

Vocational competency is defined as broad industry knowledge and experience, and may include, but is not limited to, holding a relevant unit of competency or qualification. To enable successful completion of the program, students are advised prior to enrolment to have:

- At least 3 years' experience in a vocational area they intend to teach.
- · Sufficient language and literacy skills to write a range of documentation - ASCF
- · Good communication and interpersonal skills - ASCF level 4.
- · A good working knowledge of computer programs eg: MS Office, Email and Internet research.

For those potential students wanting to enrol in this course, you will need to:

- · Complete a pre-training review to determine your level in reading, writing, oral communication and numeracy skills. An ACSF level 4 is required to be achieved by students wishing to undertake the course.
- Have access to a training environment or simulated training environment in which to conduct your workplace projects.
- · Have access to the internet and a knowledge of search engines.
- Have a minimum of three years vocational experience in your area of expertise.
- · Applicants will also need to complete a 'Pre Course Interview' document and provide their current CV at the Certificate IV in Training and Assessment (TAE40116) Information session.

People with prior experience in training and assessment should enquire about Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL).
